



## Hot Topics

**Opioid problems are increasing** among people entering treatment programs in Ontario ([DATIS](#)). And with the use of Opioids increasing among young people in the general population ([OSDUHS](#)), there is real potential for even greater long-term pressures on treatment programs.

For example, CAMH's biannual high school survey found that Ontario students doubled their non-medical use of Oxycontin, since the previous survey, and that many of them were obtaining this opioid from their parents' medicine cabinet.

This increased prevalence is leading to problems of dependence. In the past, methadone treatment has primarily been associated with heroin use, however recent evidence has shown an increased association with prescription opioids. For example, data on admissions to addiction programs shows that only 2% of people had previously used heroin while 13% had previously used prescription opioids. Although methadone is not for everyone it has helped many people to recover and lead stable lives. Unfortunately, it is not always well understood.

"The common misconception is that methadone replaces one addiction over another," says Dr. Peter Selby, Clinical Director of Addiction Programs, CAMH. "The truth is that methadone when combined with counselling and support has been proven to improve our clients' quality of life and reduce criminal activity and drug-related death." [more>](#)

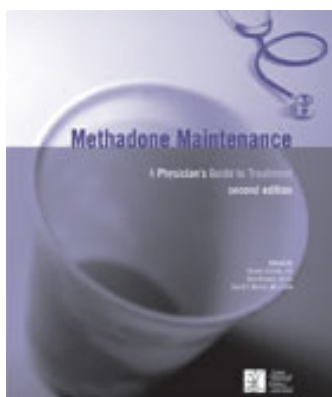
