Hot Topics

Harm Reduction – what is it anyway?

Harm reduction is a strategy to reduce harm caused by the use of alcohol, drugs and tobacco without requiring the cessation of use. Harm reduction provides for a variety of options that reduce the harms caused by the activity. Both the people involved in the activity and the families, friends and communities around them, can benefit from harm reduction strategies. Strategies include policies, program and practices with success measured in terms of individual and community quality of health. Success in harm reduction is not measured in the levels of substances a person is or is not using. The harm reduction approach views any movement in the direction of decreased harm, regardless of how small, as positive.

Examples of proven harm reduction programs are:

Alcohol – server intervention programs which decrease public drunkenness; hours of operation; random breath testing; wet shelters; and managed alcohol programs.

Drugs – needle and syringe distribution programs which prevent the transmission of HIV among injection drug users; safer crack use kits distribution; methadone maintenance programs.

Tobacco – environmental controls on tobacco smoking which limit the exposure to second hand smoke; nicotine replacement therapy; taxation on tobacco products; minimum age of purchase.

CAMH in the Community: Partnership with Windsor-Essex Drug Strategy Initiative

CAMH has always been an active partner in addressing substance use issues in Windsor-Essex County. On October 21, 2009, CAMH and the Windsor-Essex Drug Strategy Implementation Working Group/Harm Reduction Network co-sponsored the CAMH in the Community event "Understanding Harm Reduction: Role and Impact within Communities."

Over 130 local professionals representing such sectors as addiction, mental health, hospitals, police, education, family health teams and child welfare were on hand to hear Dr. Carol Strike, CAMH Senior Scientist, outline the benefits of harm reduction programs both for individuals and communities.

In addition to her presentation, local professionals from the Needle Exchange Program and the Drouillard Road Methadone Clinic gave overviews of their services and how they support individuals with substance use issues. A woman with lived experience provided a personal account of her struggle with addiction and the impact of methadone maintenance treatment in improving her health.

"The local drug strategy group and harm reduction network is currently exploring ways to conduct needs assessment and focus groups with substance users to determine their needs and determine what other types of harm reduction initiatives can assist individuals in improving their health outcomes," says CAMH Program Consultant Mark Erdelyan.

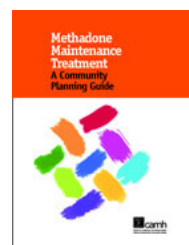
